Our Impact This Year

Take a look into some of the highlighted statistics coming from WIN House throughout 2022-2023



CRISIS CALLS ANSWERED

WIN House Crisis Intervention Workers answered 2,799 calls from people in crisis. They offered support and, when possible, admission, helping callers when they needed it most.



CALLERS TURNED AWAY

Out of 2,317 callers seeking admission, 1,774 were turned away due to a lack of space/capacity within the shelters.



RESIDENTS SHELTERED

A total of 247 adults and 288 children, accompanied by their guardians, received essential support and shelter at WIN House.




MEALS SERVED IN SHELTER



WIN House Programs

Through leveraging community partnerships, WIN House is able to continue providing on-site services for WIN House residents.



ON-SITE NURSING

The On-Site Nurse program offers individuals access to immediate and follow-up medical intervention, and provides health education and resources for WIN House residents. Residents entering WIN House often require medical intervention due to the nature of their stay. The On-Site Nurse is a Registered Nurse, provided through a partnership with Streetworks, who is available for one-on-one appointments for WIN House residents. Over the last year, our On-Site Nurse had 768 face-to-face encounters with WIN House Residents.

INDIGENOUS CULTURAL PROGRAMMING

In partnership with Bent Arrow, WIN House provides on-site access to Indigenous cultural teachings for WIN House residents. While providing cultural teachings and experiences, such as teaching circles with tea and bannock, and medicine picking, Bent Arrow also provides activities for children to engage in within the shelters.





ON-SITE COUNSELLING

WIN House, in partnership with YWCA, provides on-site counselling with a registered psychologist for residents to access free counselling support during and after their time in WIN House Shelters. In addition to the counselling hours, the YWCA offers a drop-in domestic violence support group each week, accessible to WIN House residents. While accessing on-site, free counselling, WIN House provides childcare to ensure this program is barrier free for the residents who need it. Over the last year, counselling was offered for six hours each week on-site.

Partnerships



WIN FOR GOOD

Through an exclusive and ongoing partnership with Goodwill, gently used clothing and houseware donations are turned into Goodwill gift cards for the residents in WIN House shelters. This enables our residents to purchase the clothing and items they need, while supporting the incredible work of Goodwill in providing individuals with disabilities employment opportunities to enhance their lives.

A TOY FOR EVERY CHILD

Relying on thousands of volunteers and donors, 630 CHED Santas Anonymous now collects, sorts, packages, and delivers toys to over 20,000 children each year. In 2022, WIN House joined forces and forged a partnership with the toy experts! Our partnership with Santas Anonymous means no child living in WIN House shelters goes without a gift at Christmas, or on their birthday.



MADE FROM THE HEART

Over the last 25 years, a group of fiercely dedicated Central Sewing Volunteers (CSV), have hand crafted thousands of quilts, pillowcases, clothing, baby items, large tote bags, Christmas stockings, and much more to provide comfort and support to residents in WIN House shelters and beyond. When coming to WIN House, one of the first things that residents see is a one-of-a-kind, handmade quilt from the Central Sewing Volunteers signalling comfort, community, and people who care.

BASKETS OF HOPE

We would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to our partners at Rohit Group of Companies for their annual Baskets of Hope campaign. Each year, Rohit donates hundreds of self care and comfort items. These items are received by every adult individual entering WIN House, as soon as they arrive. In 2022, Rohit donated 205 Baskets of Hope for WIN House residents! For 19 years, thanks to the generous support of our community, the Global News Give Me Shelter campaign has provided thousands of much needed items and gifts for people experiencing violence in our communities. This year, the 19th Annual Global News Give Me Shelter campaign raised \$87,000! This campaign supported 6 shelters across Edmonton. Thanks to a tremendous outpour of community generosity and corporate support this holiday season, WIN House was able to provide over fifty families and individuals with gifts and essential household items last holiday season. Many residents were able to use these items when leaving WIN House, ensuring they had essentials in their new homes. BOMA

Every year, BOMA Edmonton reflects upon the prosperity experience by our members and as a result, hosts a Holiday Luncheon charity event. The BOMA luncheon raised \$3,700 for WIN House residents last year.
