OUR IMPACT THIS YEAR

2,799

CRISIS CALLS ANSWERED

In 2022-2023, WIN House Crisis Intervention Workers answered 2,799 calls from people in crisis. They offered support and, when possible, admission, helping callers when they needed it most.

CALLERS TURNED AWAY

In 2022-2023, out of 2,317 callers seeking admission, 1,948 callers were turned away. Of these callers, 1,774 were turned away due to a lack of space/capacity within the shelters.

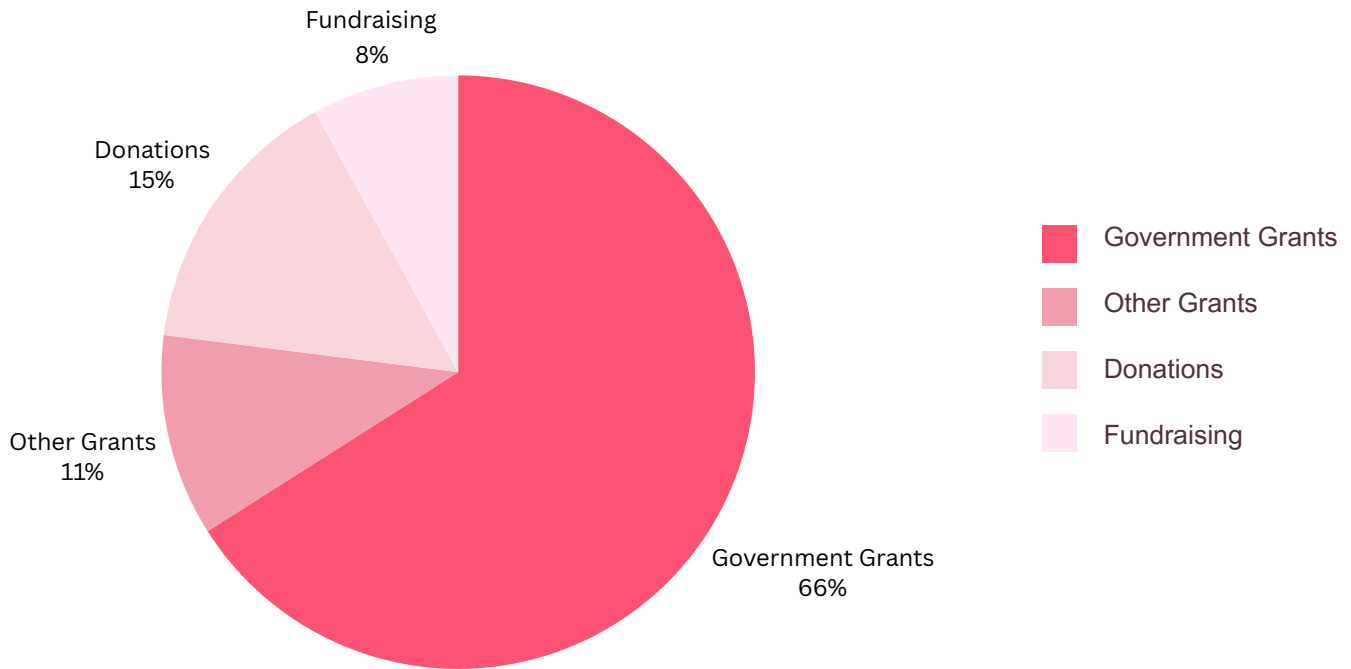
